Home to the largest and most diverse State Park system in the country, California has 1.4 million acres, over 280 miles of coastline, and 625 miles of lake and river frontage. To ensure these natural treasures are managed and protected today and for future generations, Parks California has launched its Resource Stewardship Initiative.

This effort provides the opportunity to work together at a landscape level across boundaries to make natural places more resilient for future generations. By coming together, we will keep pace with the pressures from climate change, growing populations, and other threats to natural and built environments.

- Job training and skills development to create a pipeline of park stewards and future employees among underserved populations;
